Mr Robinson Well, I don't think we have a whole lot to say to each other, Ben. I do think you should know the consequences of what you've done. I do think you should know my wife and I are getting a divorce.

Benjamin A divorce? Why?

Mr Robinson Why?

Benjamin Well, it shouldn't make *that* much difference, surely? I mean we ... we ... It was nothing at all. We could have been shaking hands.

Mr Robinson I always thought when you took your clothes off and got into bed with a woman and had sexual intercourse with her that was just a little more than shaking hands.

Benjamin Not in this case.

Mr Robinson Well, that's not saying much for my wife, is it? **Benjamin** You miss the point.

Mr Robinson Not at all Ben. I'm sure my wife's bedroom technique could do with a little brushing up.

Benjamin The point is I don't love your wife; I love your daughter.

Mr Robinson Well, I'm sure you think you do Ben, but after a few times shaking hands with Elaine I'm sure you'll find her just as disappointing.

Benjamin I'm sorry?

Mr Robinson A boy called us up and he asked for her hand. Carl is to be a doctor, and he asked for her hand in marriage. There are some fine young men in this world.

Benjamin Mr Robinson ...

Mr Robinson I don't know if I can prosecute or not, but I think maybe I can. In light of what's happened I think maybe I can get you behind bars if you even so much as look at my daughter again. I don't want to mince words with you. I think you're totally despicable. I think you're scum. I think you're filth.
